This month we are spotlighting Marilyn Joyce (Fahrenkrog) Dengler. Marilyn grew up in the Scott County area. She was born on a farm north of Plainview and then moved to a farm on Buttermilk Road, (where the Amazon plant is now) then moved just northeast of Eldridge



and lastly to the Donahue area where her father and his twin brother were born. Marilyn had 2 sisters and 1 brother. She was the oldest and is now the only one left. Some of her fondest memories were helping her Mom and Dad, playing ball games, going to dances and her Dad building a pond so they could go swimming and ice skating. Marilyn started her education in a one room schoolhouse and graduated from Davenport High in 1946 with a Normal Training Certificate allowing her to teach in a one room schoolhouse. She had to have a special certificate from Des Moines for her to teach at age 17. She finished out her career with 22 years at Blue Grass before retiring in 1990. My husband's (Warren) youngest sister and Marilyn were friends in high school, and stayed at each other's home like girls do. This was during WW11 and no new cars were being built so when Warren wanted to use the family car for a date, and if I happened to be there, his Dad would make him take his sister and I along. After a year or so he came to our house and asked my parents if he could take me to a movie. We were married 4 years later. Warren and Marilyn were dairy farmers raising purebred Guernsey's. Warren was very involved in the local milk producer's association. They bought a farm just outside of Walcott and built the first milking parlor in Scott County. They also raised corn and soybeans on 269 acres along with hogs and sheep. Once they sold the milking cows they raised steers for several years before moving to Durant. Warren and Marilyn had 5 kids, twin girls Polly & Peggy and then 3 boys Ray, Ron and Rick. They enjoyed many trips together like Washington D.C., New Jersey to see the ocean and back through the Appalachian Mountains to get back to Iowa. They attended lots of basketball games with one most memorable with their son Ron playing at Davenport Central and winning the state Championship in 1970. Marilyn will always treasure the memories of their first born son, Rick, who was tragically killed by lightning while camping with his friends on their farm in 1962. Marilyn has 13 grandchildren, 23 great grandchildren and 3 great great grandchildren. She enjoys many visits and phone calls from them all. Marilyn likes living here at Grand Haven because she has someone else taking care of the laundry and cleaning. Her friends that visit always comment on how nice the facility and apartments are.
