






Senior on Spotlight

Raymond Robert Boeding was born on a hot August day on the prairie in Glad Valley, South Dakota. The family homesteaded in 1905 after migrating from Germany. He lived his first 11 years on the prairie with his 6 brothers and 6 sisters. They were his only



In 1939 his mother decided to return to West Point, Iowa, where he completed his school years at St. Mary's High School. After graduating from high school, he worked at Shafer Pen Company as a "pen" inspector. In 1950 he was called to serve in the Army, with basic training in Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri. Then he was assigned to the combat infantry during the Korean War. After the Army, he enrolled at the University of Iowa where he received a degree in accounting, graduating in 1956. During that time he met his future wife, Joan Fitzgerald. They were married December 26, 1953. Ray worked for the Department of the Army, at Army Munitions and Chemical Command (AMCOM) as a financial analyst, ending his career as a project manager.

The couple raised 4 children in Davenport until 1970. They moved to rural Donahue, where Joan served as a school nurse at various North Scott schools. Ray has 3 living children: Mike and family live in Houston; Texas, Donald and family live in San Francisco, California and Jo Ellen in Eldridge. His daughter, Susan, died in 2022.

Vacations included spending time at a lake resort in Green Lake, Wisconsin, with neighbors and friends when the children were younger. Also trips to see the homestead in South Dakota, visiting relatives in Nebraska and the later years with family reunions at Sunrise Beach, Lake of the Ozarks.
